

Peace Run 40 Years – More Important Than Ever

Dialogue and peace – not more war.

War rhetoric is growing in Sweden and across the world. Billions are poured into military build-ups while welfare is cut back. With NATO membership, Sweden faces a greater risk of being dragged into war.

Israel's occupation of Palestine has escalated into outright genocide in Gaza, while attacks continue on the West Bank and on neighboring countries Lebanon and Syria.

Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine has now entered its third year. The invasion is a violation of international law, but the conflict cannot be solved by the U.S. and NATO sending ever more weapons.

If Israel's occupation of Palestine and Russia's war on Ukraine continue, the risk grows of wider wars – even nuclear war. This must not happen. Instead, pressure for a ceasefire and negotiations must intensify.

The U.S. blockade of Cuba continues, despite 187 of 193 countries in the UN General Assembly voting for it to be lifted, with only the U.S. and Israel opposing.

Inequality is growing in Sweden and globally. The pursuit of profit for the few is put before the needs of people and the planet. Everywhere we see policies that fuel conflicts over resources and imperialist wars.

We already have the knowledge to put people and the environment first. We fight for a world built on solidarity and harmony with nature – not on competition and imperial domination.

Instead of NATO membership under U.S. command – where our children and grandchildren risk being sacrificed in imperialist wars around the globe – Sweden needs an active, anti-imperialist peace movement.
